In the absence of Chair, Cllr Benbow ( Vice ) chaired the meeting and welcomed the invited representatives of organisations in the Community to discuss the Queens Platinum Jubilee activities.

Kerry Waters began with a summary of the suggestions put forward at the recent Sports Club meeting:

Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2022 - Fancy Dress & Sports Events - starting at 1.30 pm with a walk from Sageston School to Carew Sports Club. Suggestions and ideas are for school children to be issued with “Kazoos” playing songs chosen by choir master at Sageston school with maybe a drum to accompany and then to start off the Fun Day. County Councilor Rapi to ask at Sageston School. Suggestions also for Children and adults for Fancy Dress and themed costumes. Suggestions for sports events are gladiator type event, tug-of-war between local organisations, etc, wellie throwing competition,

Risk assessments and contacting Dyfed Powys Police regarding the walk from School to the Club along with insurance.

Carew Memorial Hall available for wet weather options.

St Johns Ambulance/First aid in attendance.

Car parking considerations need to be taken into account also.

Further suggestions on stalls on the field (or in the Hall if weather inclement)

- Liz Hyde suggested that the WI could put on a tea and scones stall, craft stall.

Necklace making, face painting/stick on “tattoos” (Cllr Benbow to explore contact regarding this) , Cllr Goodman volunteered to source or make stocks and Cllr Allen has a contact for this.

Outdoor: Bouncy castle , inflatable slide and Kerry kindly agreed to look into this.

Catering: Outsourcing food outlets maybe from Upton Farm with ice cream vans, Burger van from Carew Roundabout.

Judges and Medals - To look at medals for participants of events and to pick judges of competitions.

In the evening: Kerry Waters to look at a disco and pig roast at the Sports Club in the evening.

Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> June 2022 Martin Hyde confirmed that the Carew Cheriton Control Tower would be open from 11 til 4 with some simple competitions, and tea and light refreshments.

It was also suggested that the day of Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> June would be an opportunity for residents to undertake their own “street parties”.

In the evening: “The Numbers Racket” swing band booked to play in Carew Memorial Hall with a start time to be decided and a finish time of 12 midnight. Following considerable and lengthy discussion, the following was agreed:

No catering;

tickets between 150 and 180 – standing capacity at the Hall is 240.

Drinks available from Carew Sports Club with plastic containers not glass.

Door attendants (Cllr Benbow to enquire regarding this).

Ticket price £15. Tickets need to be printed. Posters advertising the sale and place of purchase of the tickets need to be done. Suggestions for sale points were Carew Shop, Milton Chip shop, Sports Club, Carew Inn, Plough Inn or local Councillors.

Royal theme, royal fancy dress or period outfits and maybe masks of the Queen’s face given out.

Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2022 Cllr Rev Joel Barder to liaise with other ministers regarding United Church Service in the afternoon. Suggestion made that the Quay Notes be asked if they would like to take part with a selection of appropriate themed songs.

Afterwards, Tea and cake at St Marys Church and Julie Mooney kindly agreed to liaise regarding the provision of this.

Other considerations for the weekend events are the purchase of a commemorative gift for children/residents. Suggestions Badges, bears, mugs, rulers - Cllr Benbow and Clerk to look into this with quantities and prices for next meeting.
